Everyone in the school is able to visit the garden and pupils work hard to maintain the flowers, vegetables and herbs. The children regularly compost the remains of their fruit snacks and help in the harvest of the vegetables and flowers in the summer months. In the summer of 2008 we won the Times and Citizen with Frosts School Garden of the Year competition. We regularly have a School Garden party when parents and children join in tidying, weeding and maintaining the flowerbeds and courtyard areas around the school - tea, juice and cake is included! We love the wildlife in our grounds; it is a great resource for our science lessons and this year for the first time we have a nest of six Great Tits nesting. The format of the tournament consists of 4 leagues with the winner of each league going through to a knockout stage. Weekly medals are given out to the winning teams and also to the team of the week; awarded for fair play, teamwork and perseverance.



The benefits of this event have been numerous: Located at the heart of Brickhill, the visibility and profile within our neighbourhood has given this competition a community feel for the youth and supporting adults alike. It has taken young people off the streets and away from their Xbox's and integrated participants from different schools, backgrounds and cultures. Above all however the Tuesdays evenings have been a lot of fun. Older teenagers have got involved in setting up and refereeing some of the games, younger participants have been polite, respectful and appreciative and a desire on everyone's part to enjoy themselves has made this initiative work well.

The tournament has been run by Brickhill Baptist Church in conjunction with BEDS Police, Brickhill Parish Council, BPHA, Bedford Borough Council and Extended Schools- St Thomas More Cluster.


