News from the Parish Council



The Parish Council took over responsibility for Waveney Green in 2011. A three year plan has been drawn up to assist with prioritising the work needed to keep the Green in a good, safe, condition for everyone to enjoy. Repairs have been completed on the worst sections of the footpath running across Waveney Green. A survey of trees on the green has identified some trees that need to be either removed or where some action needs to be taken. The flower bed near the play area has been cleared and will be replanted in the future. The Parish Council has submitted an application

for grant funding for play equipment for very young children; if successful, this will be installed near the existing play area. The Saturday morning football continues to brighten up the area each week, while Brickhill Baptist Church is running a short series of Football events in May and June, as well as 'Sundays on the Green' in July and August (see items elsewhere in this newsletter); if you have ideas for what else could take place on the Green, please contact the Parish Council.

At the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, Cllr Mark Fitzpatrick was re-elected as Chair of the Council, while Cllr Ray Waterhouse was re-elected as Vice-Chair. The Parish Council's Planning Committee will continue to comment on planning applications that affect Brickhill. A Working Party of councillors will continue to advise on the management of the Brickhill Allotments and Waveney Green.

Brickhill is fortunate to have a network of great footpaths leading out into the surrounding countryside. These include the John Bunyan Trail and other paths towards Clapham, Ravensden and Renhold. As part of the Community Plan, the aim is to produce some leaflets showing some of the great routes available. If you would like to help map out some routes, please contact Cllr Mark Fitzpatrick.

Brickhill Public Transport Information Update

Stagecoach Service No 6 after finally going into the Woodlands Park development and turning around in the square, within a few weeks had to be withdrawn back to the first roundabout before the development, due to safety concerns by a number of residents. The Borough together with the developer is currently investigating whether a turning circle can be introduced at the end of Ashmead Road just before Westrope Way so it can again serve all the development. The current terminus is not very satisfactory as it is too far away and with no pavement at this point, customers have to cross the road onto mud to board the bus. Stagecoach is against stopping the bus on the pavement side due to sightline concerns for motorists leaving the development.

News from your Borough Councillors

Residents contact us most frequently about vehicle issues, such as speeding and inconsiderate parking. Following requests by residents we have asked the Borough's Highways Department to look at Kestrel Road and Tyne Crescent, to try to deal with traffic from Brickhill Drive shops and St Thomas More School. We have received many requests for additional 'no verge parking' signs where vehicles are damaging the verges, for example Brickhill Drive and Plover Way.

Everybody in Brickhill should have received household battery recycling collection bags. Put your old batteries in these and leave them on your bin; you will be left a new bag. If you have any queries please call 01234 267422 or visit www.bedford.gov.uk/recycling.

Following requests we have asked for the cycle path into Bedford Park to be resurfaced this year. To report a Pot Hole on 01234 718 003.

Plans have been drawn up for a roundabout at the bottom of Ashmead Road on the Woodlands Park Estate. This will allow the buses to enter the estate and turn safely and avoid the need for parking on the access road. We have also asked for the bus shelters to be reviewed across Brickhill so that they are in the right place and people do not have to get off the bus onto muddy grass.
